

Anastasia Voltchok is an exceptional pianist, versatile artist, and life-affirming woman, born into a family of professional musicians of Russian / Ukrainian descent. She has been honored with a Doctorate of Musical Arts from the University of Maryland and a Gold Medal at the World Piano competition in 2003. Anastasia's life has been deeply influenced by music, the fine arts, and a broad worldview. She has been mentored and taught by Larissa Dedova, Rudolf Buchbinder, Andre Watts, and Santiago Rodriguez.

Anastasia Voltchok made her orchestral debut at the age of 8, performing Haydn's piano concerto. Since then, she has extensively performed throughout Western and Eastern Europe, as well as the United States, receiving high critical acclaim. During her tours, Voltchok has appeared alongside renowned orchestras such as the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, Munich Philharmonic, Mariinsky Orchestra St. Petersburg, the Bamberger Symphoniker, the Hamburger Symphoniker, Orchestra della Svizzera Italiana, Sao Paulo Philharmonic Orchestra, Orquesta Sinfonica de Navarra, and Kremerata Baltica among others.

In recent recitals, notable performances have taken place at prestigious venues including New York's Lincoln Center, Tonhalle Zurich, Santa Cecilia in Rome, Victoria Hall Geneva, and the Gulbenkian in Lisbon. Voltchok has closely collaborated with esteemed conductors and soloists such as Dennis Russell Davies, Lahav Shani, Valery Gergiev, Roman Kofman, Volodymyr Sheiko, Gidon Kremer, and Martha Argerich.

Anastasia Voltchok's performances have been broadcasted throughout Europe and the United States. Her CDs were released with Novalis, Solo Musica, Genuin and most recently with Centaur Records.
